I am a Senior Scientific Officer attached
to Physics Division of Forensic Science Laboratory,
Govt. of West Bengal. In March, 1990, I was in the
same post.

I examined a latch-cum-lock marked 'B' by
the authority sending the particular article and some
other items in connection with Shawaipore P.S. Case
No. 87 dated 6.3.90. On examination of those articles
my findings are as follows :-

Ext. B was a latch-cum-lock having sliding
bolt which keeps a door bolted from inside by spring
action when the door is pushed outward from inside
or pulled from outside. The only way to unbolt a door
thus bolted, from outside the room is by operating a
key through a key hole, and from inside the door by

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room by operating the unbolting knob. A door thus bolted could further be locked mechanically from inside the room by restricting the freedom of unbolting knob by operating a separate locking knob beside the unbolting knob.

Ext. C was a faint cream coloured button.

Ext. U was a cream coloured full sleeved open breast ~~syn~~ synthetic shirt. All the buttons stitched on the shirt excepting the third button from the top on the front vertical button plate were light cream coloured and stitched in similar pattern with off white thread of 3 ply and x type twist, whereas the third button was white, stitched in a different pattern with milky white thread of 2 ply and Z type ~~tw~~ twist.

Mark of application of force, downward with respect to the shirt could be observed beneath the third white button, at the position where the original button had been stitched.

All the buttons on the front button plate of the shirt (U) excepting the third white button were cut off and compared with the button marked C. It was observed that the button C was similar with the button cut off from the shirt in respect of shape, dimensions, colour and weight upto the hundredth part of a miligram.

The paper packet W contained one black baggie T-shirt, one brass ~~tw~~ and one chadder. Marks of application of force in the form of disjoining

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of stitches 5 cms. on the right, 4.5 cms. on the left of the left shoulder joints could be observed. The brassiere and chaddar had no significant mark of violence. This is the report prepared and signed by me. It is marked ext. 30.

The metallic chain marked L of length 55 cms. bore mark of application of force in the form of opening of joint of fixed ring, soldered on one side of the middle hooking ring.

This report was prepared and signed by me. It is marked ext. 31.

I have been acting as an expert with the Forensic Science Laboratory since 1978.

X-examination on behalf of the accd.

The button would be severed from the shirt as noted by me in Ext. U in my report if the same comes in contact of a hard and blunt substance like hook and is pulled. In that shirt the 3rd button was of different type and it had been replaced with different stitching pattern and different colour. The five buttons in the shirt marked U had been cut by me for the purpose of comparison. There were six buttons in the shirt. One of the buttons had been kept intact and the five others were cut by me. These are the five buttons which had been cut by me from shirt marked U in my report. The five buttons be marked material Ext. XIV (collectively there is no seal on the covering of each of the buttons of my office showing that the case has been examined.

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Witness volunteers- All these small packets had been kept in an envelope which bears the seal of our office. The button marked B had not been opened today in my presence by breaking open the seal of the larger packet. I measured the weight of each of the five buttons and recorded the same. The weights of each of the buttons are not the same but they are different from each other. The button marked C in my report was also packed by me in a similar packet as the other five buttons had been kept. I took the weight of that button also and weighed the same. This is the packet in which I kept the button and noted the weight of the same (witness identifies material exhibit marked X). The button which was stitched on the shirt had not been weighed by me.
